UV Awareness Month: Protecting Your Skin

"According to the CDC, UV radiation from the sun helps produce vitamin D but can cause sunburn, premature aging, and skin cancer with overexposure. Protecting against UV radiation is crucial year-round.

As you enjoy the summer sun, it's essential to remember that while your skin naturally produces vitamin D when exposed to UV rays, there are safer ways to ensure we get enough of this vital nutrient. Dietary sources and vitamin supplements are recommended over UV exposure, as they do not increase the risk of skin cancer and provide a reliable way to meet your needs.

UV rays are strongest between 10 am and 4 pm, particularly during spring and summer months, though their intensity can vary with location and weather conditions. Cloud cover does not fully block UV rays, and they can reflect off surfaces such as water, sand, and even grass, increasing exposure levels.

To protect yourself and others:

- Find shade during the peak sun hours of 10 am to 4 pm.
- Wear protective clothing like long sleeves & pants.
- Use a wide-brimmed hat to shade your face, ears, and neck.
- Wear sunglasses that block both UVA and UVB rays to safeguard your eyes.
- Apply sunscreen with SPF 15 or higher, ensuring it provides broad-spectrum (UVA and UVB) protection.

By following these simple precautions, you can enjoy the outdoors safely while protecting your skin from harmful UV rays. Remember, a little prevention goes a long way in maintaining healthy skin and overall well-being." -District Health Department.




