What is health literacy? Healthy People 2024 defines personal health literacy as "the degree to which individuals can find, understand, and use information and services to inform health-related decisions and actions for themselves and others." In the U.S., according to studies, more than 40 percent of Americans have difficulty obtaining, processing, and understanding basic healthcare information, which is necessary for making informed decisions. When healthcare professionals communicate in an easy-to-understand manner, we all benefit.

Consider these helpful tips to help you be more health literate:

- Ask questions if you do not understand the information provided by the healthcare professional
- Tell your healthcare professional if you are worried about being able to follow their instructions
- Ask questions about any medications to ensure you have a clear understanding of the dosage and any associated side effects
- Request information in written format so that you have a reference to review after your medical appointment
- Don't be afraid to call the office for additional clarification once you return home
- Consider bringing another person to a medical appointment to help take notes and clarify any information to be "well-informed" Talking With You Doctor or Health Care Provider
